

SEALING VS. EXPUNGEMENT: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

Although the procedure is similar, there are several major differences between Sealing and Expungements. Please conduct your own research to determine which is right for you. The Clerk of Court's office is not able to assist you with this decision.

Sealing:

-The fee for a Motion to Seal a Conviction is \$50.00, and for a Motion to Seal a Dismissal or Not Guilty Finding there is no fee.

-Felony cases closed by Indictment cannot be sealed in our court. The Motion to Seal must be filed in Common Pleas Court.

Expungement:

-The filing fee for a Motion to Expunge a Conviction is \$100.00.

-Dismissals and Not Guilty Findings are NOT expungable.

If the case is a conviction, the petitioner must wait for ONE YEAR from the last action on the case before they can file the Motion to Seal/Expunge. Dismissals or Not Guilty findings can have Motions to Seal filed at any time. Once the Motions for either of these are filed, they will be sent to the Prosecutor. The Judge's office will set a hearing date for the Motion which the petitioner will be required to attend.
